Museum News - Did you know that there are over one hundred 1860 settlers listed on the Pioneer Monument on the Hyrum City Square? The Hyrum Historic Preservation Commission has been collecting information on these settlers and is preparing a booklet with the information. If you'd like to learn more about this project and some of these settlers, then join us for our Super Saturday event, "Headstones & Heritage" on Saturday, October 28th. We will be offering our annual riding Tour of Historic Hyrum for the first time since the pandemic. Those interested must sign up to reserve a seat and should meet at the museum at 12:30 p.m. This tour will end at the cemetery, then a second tour will start at the cemetery at 2:00 p.m. to explore the heritage of some of Hyrum's 1860 settlers. Tours will be guided by Historic Preservation Commission Members John Petersen, Steve Downs, and Roger Allen. (Transportation back to the museum will be provided for those joining the driving tour, but who aren't interested in the cemetery tour.) The museum will also be open that day from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

The museum's annual "Trick or Treat" Back in Time children's activity will run October 24th - 26th from 1:00-1:30 p.m. each day. We will learn a little about the people and folklore of Hyrum's past as we trick or treat around the museum. All children are welcome to attend from preschool-aged to older kids who are homeschooled, and we encourage coming in costumes! To ensure enough treats for all kids, we REQUIRE SIGN-UP for this activity.
