Legal Fireworks Discharge – The 2025 Utah State Law for legal fireworks discharge is: July $2^{nd} - 5^{th}$ & July $22^{nd} - 25^{th}$ between 11:00 a.m. – 11:00 p.m., except on July 4^{th} & 24^{th} when discharge hours extend until midnight.

Election Updates - Candidates and Dates: The following individuals have filed for Mayor in Hyrum City (1 seat available)- Stephanie Miller, Steve J. Miller, and Shara Toone; and for City Council in Hyrum City (2 seats available) - Joshua Kyle Cannon, Jared Clawson, NaLyn Nelson, Paul James, Rebecca Foulger, and Kevin J. Petersen.

There being more than twice the number of candidates filed for both the Mayor seat and City Council seats than are available, a Primary Election will be held on August 12, 2025. The names of the two Mayor candidates, and four City Council candidates that receive the majority of the votes in the Primary Election will be placed on the November ballot. The Municipal General Election will be held on November 4, 2025.

Important Ballot Deadline & Changes: Elections in Hyrum City will be conducted by Vote by Mail. Ballots for the Primary Election will be mailed to all registered voters starting July 22, 2025, and the General Election will be mailed to all registered Hyrum City Voters starting October 14, 2025.

Please be aware of a significant change to Utah Election Law. Postmarks will no longer be accepted as proof of timely submission. For a ballot to be counted, it must be in the possession of the County election office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. This means that even if a voter visits the post office on Election Day and has their ballot

envelope stamped, it will not be valid unless it physically arrives at the election office by 8:00 p.m. on August 12 for the Primary Election and 8:00 p.m. on November 4 for the General Election.

Hyrum City strongly encourages voters to return their ballots early or use the official drop boxes to ensure their vote is counted. A Voter Drop Box is available at the Hyrum City Offices 60 West Main in the planter strip between the Elite Hall and Fire Department.

Candy Cabin Store – The candy cabin store located just west of the Hyrum Library will be open through August 7th for the summer on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

National Night Out Against Crime – Hyrum will be hosting the annual National Night Out Against Crime on Tuesday, August 5th at 6:00 p.m. on the City Square in conjunction with many communities across Utah and the United States. National Night Out, a yearlong community building campaign, is designed to: 1) heighten crime prevention awareness, 2) generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime programs, 3) strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships, and 4) send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

Hyrum will be providing free hamburgers as well as hosting various law enforcement groups and other community service providers. These groups will have information available as well as demonstrations.

Ordinance Highlight - 17.72.010 Permitted Signs

Temporary sign any sign, banner, pennant, balloon or advertising display constructed of paper, cloth, canvas, light fabric, cardboard, wallboard or other light materials, with or without light frames, intended to be displayed outdoors for short periods of time usually no more than 30 days. Examples: Political signs, grand openings, garage sales, school activities, chuck wagon breakfasts or other City sponsored events. Temporary signs must be removed within 24 hours of the event for which it was erected. Gas filled balloons (unmanned) must be securely tethered and must not exceed ten feet in height at the end of the tether.

A senior center is not a funeral home, and you certainly don't need to feel old to attend. In the last few months, for a few of our field trips, we've gone snowshoeing, done archery, rock climbing, canoeing, hiking (multiple times), and more. Do those sound like "old people" activities? Didn't think so. We are a center for all older adults (55 and up), of all interests and ability levels. Of course, we do Bingo, Bunco, quilt, play pool and do the other things that you'd expect too, because those are also fun!

If you haven't been in recently (remember, we got a new director less than a year ago and a LOT has changed in the last year), check us out sometime. The Hyrum Senior Center isn't just for "old people". Joining us for lunch would be a great way to dip your toe in and check us out. Shannon (our cook) serves some amazing meals every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at noon. Lunch is a suggested \$3 donation, and you can RSVP by calling or texting us at 435-245-3570. Inquire about dietary accommodations if needed.

Our exercise classes would be another great first way to experience the senior center. The same days as our lunches (M,W,F), at 10:00 a.m. Chair Yoga on Mondays, SilverSneakers on Wednesdays, and Strong Bodies on Fridays. Just drop in, no RSVP required. We want you to be healthy, and that means moving your body. Our fitness instructors are experts in helping you do that. Line dancing at 9:15 a.m. on Tuesdays is a fun option too!
