*Information included in this newsletter is printed in advance, therefore is subject to change without notice. * **Mayors Message** – Fall is a smart time to refresh your knowledge of Utah's school zone & crosswalk laws. As thousands of kids head back to school in our community, brushing up on your rights & responsibilities as a driver could prevent a serious pedestrian injury. Protecting children in school zones takes following the speed limit, watching the road, yielding to pedestrians in crosswalks, not driving distracted, and obeying a crossing guard's directions. (Did you know Hyrum City hires 2 crossing guards at both elementary schools?)

Pedestrians using the crosswalk will always have the right-of-way. You must come to a complete stop before entering the crosswalk to allow waiting or walking pedestrians to cross.

A crosswalk that has a pattern of wide striped lines running from curb to curb – like a ladder – is a designated school crosswalk. According to state law, a motorist must wait for a pedestrian to walk all the way across the street to the opposite sidewalk before proceeding, whether school is in session or not.

For a crosswalk with just two solid parallel lines stretching from curb to curb, a driver only must wait for a pedestrian to reach the other half of the street, or the portion of the street that the vehicle is not traveling on.

If a vehicle has stopped at a crosswalk in a school zone, stop behind the vehicle. Never try to pass a vehicle that has stopped to allow pedestrians to cross the street.

If you are the parent of a child who will be walking to school this year, teach them pedestrian safety. Walk with your child to school until they can walk safely and responsibly alone.

I hope this will be a fun & safe school year.

Important Ballot Deadline & Changes: Elections in Hyrum City will be conducted by Vote by Mail. Ballots for the General Election will be mailed to all registered Hyrum City Voters starting October 14, 2025.

Please be aware of a significant change to Utah Election Law. Postmarks will no longer be accepted as proof of timely submission. For a ballot to be counted, it must be in the possession of the County election office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. This means that even if a voter visits the post office on Election Day and has their ballot envelope stamped, it will not be valid unless it physically arrives at the election office by 8:00 p.m. on November 4 for the General Election.

Hyrum City strongly encourages voters to return their ballots early or use the official drop boxes to ensure their vote is counted. A Voter Drop Box is available at the Hyrum City Offices 60 West Main in the planter strip between the Elite Hall and Fire Department.

Ordinance Highlight – Residential Solicitation Registered Solicitors with Hyrum City are issued an Identification Badge that must be prominently worn while Soliciting. The Identification Badge has Hyrum City's logo & information, the name of the Registered Solicitor, the address and phone number of the Registered Solicitor, a recent photograph of the Registered Solicitor and the date on which the Certificate expires. Registered Solicitors are deemed to constitute "No Solicitation" signs at residences. Registered Solicitors are only allowed to solicit at residences from 9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. Please call the Hyrum City Office to report unregistered solicitors, questions or for more information.
