**Parking Restrictions -** Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way, unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists for a period longer than fifteen minutes when loading or unloading or delivering property between the hours of 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect until April 1st, even when there is no snow.

**Indoor Walking** - As winter sets in, don't forget that the Elite Hall is open for free public walking hours every Monday-Friday from 6:30-10:00 a.m. All are welcome, but please supervise children and don't bring any food or drinks other than water.

**Ordinance Highlight -** 10.20.095 Snow Removal It is unlawful for any person removing snow from any parking lot, driveway, or sidewalk to push, blow, or otherwise deposit such snow onto the roadway of any public street or push it across said roadway in such a manner as to leave a residue or otherwise increase the amount of snow on the roadway. (Ord.06-01)

**Museum News -** Did you know the process of making molasses involves crushing the sugar beets or sugarcane plants to extract juice, boiling the juice to form sugar crystals, and then boiling the remaining liquid multiple times to create different strengths? In 1861, Ira Allen operated a molasses mill sweetening the city's candy, cakes, pies, fruits and other desserts. In the late 1800s, molasses was a common, affordable sweetener. Today it is an essential ingredient for American gingerbread,



providing the signature dark color, deep flavor, and chewy texture. All children are invited to learn more about molasses at our "Gingerbread Kids" Back in Time children's activity on December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>

& 4<sup>th</sup> from 1:00-1:30 p.m. each day. Since we'll be decorating gingerbread men, sign-up is strongly encouraged.
