**Mayors Message** – The Hyrum City Library is a wonderful asset to our community. The library averages over 22,000 items monthly which includes; books, DVD's, e-books, and e-audio titles available for library patrons to download. Patrons can also request inter-library loans and use the library's computers. Children can attend weekly story time on Mondays for ages 0-3 and Wednesdays for ages 3-5. Many programs are held monthly, which include teen and elementary age activities. There is great participation in the Summer Reading Program which consists of a kick-off party, story times, building days, movies, and ends with a pool party.

The annual book sale is the library's biggest fund raiser. Bricks with your name engraved can be purchased to add to the donor wall. All money raised goes toward increasing the book selection, or purchasing equipment for the library. Hyrum has an agreement with Nibley City & Wellsville City, which allows their residents to get also get a library card at the Hyrum Library. These two cities then reimburse Hyrum yearly for each active library card.

The library is staffed by a part-time head librarian: Emily Coltrin; and eight part-time librarians; RoseMary Johnson, Diane Harris, Catherine Adderly, Heidi Taylor, Abigail Richardson, Ashlyn Bingham, Madison Myers and Melissa Roberts. Monica Cortezaro keeps the building clean and inviting. A Library Advisory board made up of residents from Hyrum, Nibley & Wellsville meet bi-monthly to make recommendations on the way the library is operated. I appreciate each of the contributions they make to the success of our library.

**Museum News** – Did you know that after arriving at Maughan's Fort (Wellsville) and exploring the valley on horses Alva & Moroni Benson and Ira & Andrew Allen led their small party to settle at Camp Hollow on April 8, 1860 because they determined it had sufficient water and good enough soil to support a community. By the end of the month they established Fort Hyrum, which ran east along present-day Main Street from Center Street. Can you imagine building a cabin or living in a wagon box during this time of the year?

During April the museum is excited to host two great events in anticipation of the upcoming 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the completion of the nation's first transcontinental railroad in Promontory, Utah! First, all children are invited to attend our Back in Time activity Workin' on the Railroad on April 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, & 18<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 - 1:30 p.m. each day. Sign-up is preferred so please visit, email, or call the museum. Second, we are pleased to announce that Darren Parry, Chairman of the Northwestern Band of the Shoshone Nation, will be presenting on the impact the construction of the railroad had on Native Americans at the museum's third annual Diversity Night on Saturday, April 20<sup>th</sup>. His remarks will begin at 5:30 p.m. with food and activities to follow until 8:00 p.m.
