Members are appointed by the mayor with the advice and consent of the city council – without regard to political consideration and solely upon their qualifications for the position. These individuals live in the corporate limits of Hyrum City and voluntarily help maintain the general plan as well as zoning & subdivision ordinances. The planning commission hold a

public meeting the second Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the city council chambers. Additional meetings may be called as conditions require. Notification of meetings as well as agendas are posted on the city website, www.hyrumcity.com. Commissioners consider and make recommendations regarding conditional use applications, subdivisions, zoning changes and other land-use issues before they are brought before the city council. City Administrator Ron Salvesen participates in these meetings and Shalyn Maxfield is the secretary.

Burn Permits - If you have clippings, bushes, plants and pruning's from trees you would like to burn, please remember you must first obtain a burn permit. Every day the clearing is checked with the Utah Division of Air Quality to determine if burning will be allowed.

Permits may be issued **until May 30th**.

Additional information and the burn permit application can be completed online at www.cachecounty.org by clicking the flame image in the "I Want to..." section or by calling 800-458-0145. If your fire extends beyond your control you should immediately call the fire department at 911.

Election Notice – Notice is hereby given that Hyrum City will hold a Municipal Election this fall to elect three candidates to serve four year terms on the Hyrum City Council.

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1. Be a United States citizen; 2. Be a registered voter of the City; 3. Be a resident of Hyrum City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and 4. Not be a convicted felon, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored.

Persons desiring to be candidates for the 2019 Hyrum City Municipal Election must file a declaration of candidacy form or nomination petition between June 3, 2019 and June 7, 2019 at the City Recorder's Office, 60 West Main, Hyrum, Utah weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

The primary election, if necessary, will be held Tuesday, August 13, 2019 and the municipal election will be held Tuesday, November 5, 2019.
