

Q8 Where would you prefer to see more duplexes/fourplexes?





Q12 What are your thoughts on the current road network?











Q15 How should Hyrum City prioritize transportation projects and investments?















Q31 What types of natural and cultural resources should the community prioritize?










Q35 Are any of Hyrum City public facilities or community services in need of improvement(s)?


Q40 Where is your primary residence? (use the map provided if you are unsure of your answer)

Q41 Q41: How long have you lived in Hyrum?



Q42 Q42: How many people live in your home?


